Old Business

Engagement Grant. There was no report.

SDI Report. Melissa Hodges reported that the Sculpture Tour Salina would begin this Saturday at 11:00 a.m. with the unwrapping of 26 sculptures. There will be live entertainment and materials will be available at the Art Center for families wishing to create a sculpture.

A bike race will be held Sunday from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. in the downtown area and a video will be recorded featuring various performing groups.

Hog Roast Planning Committee. Mike Wilson reported that planning is continuing for this event, which will be held Saturday, June 7th from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. in Thomas Park. The participation of blue grass musicians, Bill Burrows and Sue Scriven, has been confirmed and new activities will include the Salina Kids on Bikes program and a rain barrel drawing.

2014 Strategic Planning Update. Jon Blanchard continued the discussion from previous meetings. Five categories had been determined and each was ranked by attendees from a first to fifth preference. The results were

- 1. Regional park concept and recreational opportunities, no votes for first preference;
- 2. Economic development, six votes for first preference;
- 3. After-school youth engagement activities, four votes for first preference;
- 4. Redevelopment planning, five votes for first preference and
- 5. Community engagement and involvement, four votes for first preference.
